Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 6:34 PM.

Attendance: Barbara Griffin; Nina Martin-Anzuoni; Tim Slowinski; Randy Crochier, Health Agent; Alice Wozniak, Clerical Assistant and Ronald Culver, resident.

1. Approve the Minutes of 5/14 **Nina moved to approve the Minutes of May 14th as written, Tim Slowinski seconded. Passed unanimously.**
2. Health Agent Updates: **Randy is light on housing updates as Jasmine Ward who handles many of those, has broken her leg and is out of commission for at least 6+ weeks.**

Housing Issues:

- a. Griswoldville Sewer District updates [2 septic plans applications submitted; decision on either?] **Issued septic permit for Amphridrome system in May.**
- b. 2 Coombs Hill Rd. [issue with egress, smoke detectors and no heat; **Order to Correct issued February 13, 2025] No update.**
- c. 6 Greenfield Rd. [**Order to Correct issued for Housing Code [HC] violations- August 14, 2025; Title 5 on 12/6/25; HC hearing June 26th; updates?**] Housing Court did rule that the Town will recover most of the legal fees that it has expended.
- d. 269 Heath Rd. [Letter sent, possible case for housing court] **No update.**
- e. 116 Main Rd [Notice of Noncompliance sent; update, if any]. **Might be headed towards Tax Title for nonpayment of taxes.**

Title 5/septics:

1. 107 Adamsville Rd. [Condemned; new owner] **No movement so working with Maja Kazmierczak from the Attorney General's Neighborhood Renewal Program to see if this property is a candidate now that the taxes are current.**
2. 257 Greenfield Rd. [Perc done September 9th; repair to be done in 2026.] **Chris Stoddard, designer, will have the plan done this week.**
3. 61 Heath Rd. [2025 campground permit with conditions, septic incomplete?] **Project is complete, remove from next meeting's agenda.**
4. 162 S. Green River Rd. [Tight tank application submitted; install in 2026] **Moving forward, it's on the Conservation Commission's agenda for later this month.**

Debris/Trash/Misc:

- 22 Heath Rd [Update on violations and Notice of Inspection letter sent August 12, 2025] **On Jasmine's list.**
- 259 Ed Clark Rd. [significant debris in yard & now on neighbors' land] **Ron Culver, property owner, was in attendance. He set up an inspection time for August 3RD at 1PM and they exchanged cell numbers. Mr. Culver said that there are currently 2 dumpsters at the property and they are actively working on it.**

***Randy updated that several Title 5's that are scheduled in Colrain. CPHS is actively working on recreational camp permits now; Nina noted that there are a couple in Colrain. The one at the Baptist Church is mornings only so it doesn't meet the criteria for a camp. Snacks are brought in and no cooking happens there. Colrain Community Church and River Valley Christian Church don't appear to have any camp programs.

3. Health District Update-May 28th & June 25th CPHS oversight meetings
 - a. **A mosquito tested positive for West Nile Virus in Deerfield.**
 - b. **The air quality is very poor due to the fires in Canada. PurpleAir has an App where people can monitor it in real-time.**
 - c. **There was a mock pool inspection at the Buckland Rec.**
4. Information from Multi-Town Senior Services Meeting: June 11th **Nina and Barbara both went to the meeting in Shelburne at the Police Department. A major discussion is the need for town-wide messaging; chain of security and what to do in the event of a security breach. The power company needs to know if there are individuals on oxygen or ventilators but not the specifics of their mobility, eat/rest issues or medications. Chief Chris Lannon and Shelburne Detective Tucker Jenkins are working on this and would like to get something more formal in place in conjunction with the Franklin County Sheriff's Office.**
5. Schedule condemnation hearings **Possibly schedule for August meeting or in the fall.**
6. Special Needs Emergency Registry Information Session update **What would our seniors need in an emergency. Similar information as noted in #4.**
7. Public Health Emergency Preparedness Training Update Online training **Barbara attended. The focus is on how to add structure to a chaotic situation. There are classes through Federal Emergency Management Association [FEMA], including Incident Command System [ICS 100] and National Incident Management System [NIMS 700]**
8. Opioid Settlement update [present to Selectboard] **Pheobe Walker needs to go to a Selectboard meeting and update them on the use of the Opioid money. Barbara will reach out to Diana, Town Administrator, about this.**
9. Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan [role of the board in it] **Does the Town have one? Barbara will reach out to Diana, Town Administrator, about this.**
10. Choose TRAIN module for next meeting **The board agreed to work on the ICS 100 training instead of one of the TRAIN modules.**
