## About this report:

This month's report has been updated with the following changes: "Gratitude" has been changed to "joys and successes" to reflect our team agreements, "Adult services" and "Youth services" are combined into "Programs and services"

## Joys and successes:

- We submitted the annual financial report and final report for the Libraries Transform Communities
  grant the last week of September. As a part of the grant report, we were also required to share our
  story with local news and representatives, so we reached out also to the *Greenfield Recorder*,
  Colrain Select Board and to Senator Comerford, who responded, "This is terrific! Thank you for
  sharing!" We're grateful to the *Recorder* for the coverage and to everyone who has helped by
  sharing the link!
- The Carol Purington Poetry Collective is always a joy and success! The group met on Friday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, with 11 participants in total! A highlight of this meeting was Caleb Kimberley's recitation of "O Captain, My Captain." After the meeting, we received an email from one participant saying the following:

I can't tell you how much I appreciate your leading this group. Though it's a little tough to get to know people on zoom instead of in person, this is such a great group of people. I am also loving the exposure to poetry, which I hadn't really read for many years, but just started reading again about a year ago.

- Thanks to Mike Slowinski for attending to the lights in front of GML, two of which were moved for the paving project, and for upgrading our bulbs to LED.
- It's been great to collaborate more with the Heath Public Library and Arms Library in Shelburne Falls, both in discussing our joys and challenges as directors, strategizing, and planning programs.
- Brady at Pine Hill reports awesome feedback about the Story Walk. She shared one story about a
  homeschool group planning a trip to Colrain solely to visit the Story Walk. This is a great example of
  a partnership that helps to bring business to Colrain, while also promoting early childhood literacy
  and outdoor activity.

## **Building and grounds:**

- In addition to the lighting upgrades in the front of the building, we received some feedback from patrons, and also have observed, that the new books display is not bright/accessible enough. Chelsea will speak to some possible changes at the trustees' meeting on October 18<sup>th</sup>.
- The sidewalk and paving construction looks terrific! Unfortunately, it meant that the library driveway and access were closed for two days, October 14<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>. We didn't learn about this until

Wednesday the 13<sup>th</sup>. We posted to Facebook, including the "Colrain, yeah, I'm from there," page, and to our website, and reached out to some patrons whom we knew are not online.

• We are invited/scheduled to present to the Colrain select board October 26<sup>th</sup> regarding our vision for GML. Chelsea will speak more to this at the trustees' meeting on October 18<sup>th</sup> and share her presentation in advance of the select board meeting on the 26<sup>th</sup>.

  needs and possibilities.
